Amy had her own newspaper route for three years while in grade school and attended William Henry Harrison High School where she excelled in academics and cross country. She attended both Indiana University and USI, participating in two Division National Championships running Cross Country. Amy earned the first All American status in Cross Country at USI and later participated in two relay events in Japan. Amy graduated from the University of Southern Indiana with a degree in Respiratory Therapy. She was an exceptional mother and a great cook. Amy will be greatly missed by all who knew her for her free spirit, passion for helping others, creativity, especially with crafts.

Amy was a dedicated employee as a Respiratory Therapist at St. Mary's Hospital (St. Vincent's) for 18 years. Her dedication led her to Deaconess Hospital, where she was currently employed as a Respiratory Therapist, on the front line of the COVID-19 crisis.

Amy is survived by her husband-soulmate Timmy Wallis; her parents Lyman and Shirley Roll, sons: Bryce and Blake Baumgart, both of Evansville, IN; stepdaughters: Timmyra Wallis (Jason) and Autumn Dickerson (Teco), brothers: Steven Roll and Stuart Roll both of Evansville, IN; her special Aunt Sharon Wilson (Ernie), niece Renee Roll, and a host of aunts, uncles and cousins.

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
