June 1, 1919 - April 12, 2013

Alliene (Walker) Barwe, age 93, of Evansville, passed away Friday, April 12, 2013 at the West Park Rehabilitation Center.

Mrs. Barwe had worked for Pearl Laundry and at Republic Aviation during World War II as a "Rosie the Riveter". She was a member of Sacred Heart Catholic Church, where she had led the rosary prior to weekday and Sunday masses for 16 years and a member of the Daughters of Isabella.
