Alvin J. Schiff, 83, of Evansville, passed away Wednesday, August 30, 2006 at VNA Charlier Hospice Center.

Mr. Schiff was employed as a truck driver for Time-D.C. for 34 years before retiring in 1982. He was a member of St. Boniface Catholic Church and Twin Towers where he served on the founding Board of Directors. He was also a member of American Legion Funkhouser Post #8, where he regularly attended monthly dinners with his four sons.
