



## Billy T. Nicholson

April 28, 1927 - July 21, 2007

Billy T. Nicholson, age 80, of Mt. Vernon, died Saturday, July 21, 2007 at Deaconess Hospital.

Billy was a former partner of Engineer Associates and currently President of Nicholson Surveying, Inc. He had served his country during WW II as a member of the U.S. Air Force.

He was a member of Zion United Church of Christ Lippe and served on the Church Council. He was a member of the West Side Optimist Club and the English Horsemen Society and was active with Habitat of Evansville. He was a former volunteer fireman for McCutchanville Fire Department and a past member of the Marrs Township Fire Department Board.
