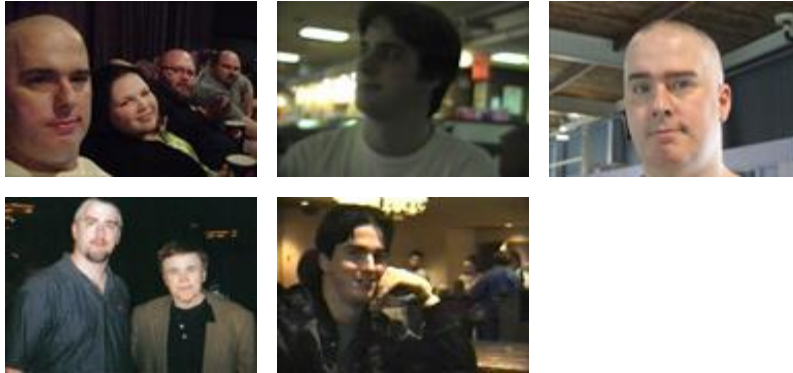

In the weeks that followed he would send a Skype message that he was ready to record. I didn't have the heart to tell him no and in the following two years he became a valuable part of the show.

He was, as I am, a lover of Star Trek. So when I quote a funeral scene in one of the series, he would totally find it appropriate. The words will be different but the meaning the same.
