Christine V. Alvey, 94, of Evansville passed away November 29. She was preceded in death by husband Joseph; sons Steven (Joe) and Perry Alvey; parents and 8 siblings. Chris found a second rewarding career as a Foster Grandparent, working for another 20 years as "Grandma Chris" at St. Vincent's Day Care on First Avenue.
