Christopher Charles "Chris" Ross, age 40, of Granger, IN, formerly of Evansville, passed away Thursday, October 11, 2012 in Granger.

Chris was a lead representative for BASF in the Paint Division and was an avid hockey and soccer fan, especially of Manchester United.
