Clarence G. Weber, age 81, of Evansville, passed away Tuesday, March 12, 2014 at his home, surrounded by his family.

Clarence was born September 12, 1932 to the late George and Anna (Matz) Weber. His father died when Clarence was just 16, so he, along with his older brother took charge of the family. Clarence served in the Korean War from 1952 to 1954 as a member of the United States Army. He married the love of his life, Rosemary Hayden on May 14, 1955. Clarence worked as a skilled carpenter all of his life. He worked alongside his uncle, Joe Matz at Ohio Valley Homes, before retiring from Dan Buck Construction.

In the spring and summer Clarence loved farming and gardening, but the winter months were spent the last 40 years researching the family history. His family was the most important thing in his life.

He was a charter member of Corpus Christi Catholic Church and a member of the Evansville City Clabber League.
