Dale E. Carrell, 94, of Evansville, passed away Sunday, December 6, 2020 at Deaconess Hospital Midtown Campus.

Dale was born July 4, 1926 in Evansville to the late Elymus and Matilda (Rothemeier) Carrell. He was a veteran of the United States Army; worked in the Engineering and Tool & Die Department for Mead Johnson and later Bristol Myers before retiring in 1992. 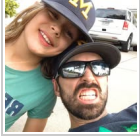
