Daniel Allen Trent, 35, of Evansville, passed away Thursday, June 29, 2006 at his home.

Daniel was employed in maintenance and carpentry work.

He was a kind and gentle spirit, eager to please others, always placing the needs of others above his own. His eagerness to please often led him in and out of substance abuse and ultimately led to his premature death.

He is survived by his mother, Sharon K. Trent of Evansville, his father and step mother, Clarence and Jane Trent of Georgetown, KY, his twin sister, Danette Briscoe and his brother, Bennie Trent, both of Evansville. His grandmother, Maxine Trent of Mt. Vernon and one aunt, two uncles, three nieces and one nephew also survive Daniel.
