

## Darryl "Skip" Frazer

August 22, 1934 - February 21, 2025

Darryl J. "Skip" Frazer, 90, of Evansville, passed away on Friday, February 21, 2025, at Deaconess Hospital Midtown Campus.

Skip was born on August 22, 1934, in Evansville to the late Elmer and Goldie (Waite) Frazer. He was a veteran of the United States Navy and United States Marine Corps. Skip began his work career at Faultess Caster, then later at Zeidler Floral Company and then at American Standard. Most of his work career was spent at Central Beverage as the sales manager of the Wine Division. Never one to sit still, Skip went to work at Pierre Funeral Home as a greeter after his wife Norma passed away in 1998. He was a friendly face at Pierre for many years. Skip was an IHSAA basketball and football official for twenty-seven years, a member of the Southern Indiana Official's Association, the Downtown Quarterback Club, past president of the St. Joe Men's Club and the Fendrich Men's Club.

Skip was an amazing man, if you knew him you loved him. He worked hard and played even harder. He loved to dress well and eat well, especially celebrating the holidays with his family. He enjoyed playing clabber with his wife, Norma and friends, John and Mary. He loved IU basketball, Notre Dame football and his many friends at the Huddleback Club. He also loved golf, even though it didn't always love him back. Skip loved many things, especially vanilla ice cream, but nothing more than his family and life itself.

Surviving Skip are two sons and their wives, Greg and Santina Frazer and Mark and Joan Frazer; seven grandchildren, Brandon (Kelly) Frazer, Matthew (Candice) Frazer, Kristen (Joey) Arnold, Nick (Michelle) Frazer, Courtney (Andrew) Carter, Logan (Brooke) Frazer, and Alexander (Christin) Frazer and twelve great grandchildren, Gavin Frazer, Zachary and Evelyn Frazer, Jack, Carson, Sam and Hugh Arnold, Noah, Cole, and Lucas Frazer, Clara and Lucy Frazer.

In addition to his parents, Skip was preceded in death by his wife of 44 years, Norma (Bredenkamp) Frazer in 1998 and by a sister, Norma Felix.

There will be a Mass of Christian Burial held at 10:00 AM on Tuesday, February 25, 2025, at Good Shepherd Catholic Church, Rev. Zach Etienne officiating. Burial will follow in St. Joseph Catholic Cemetery, where the Vanderburgh County Retired Veterans Memorial Club will conduct military rites.

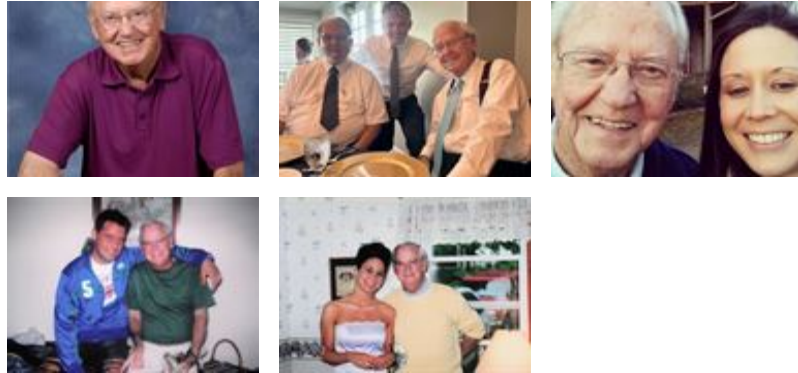
