He passed away at home, and at age 78, was still active and independent. He had an excellent grasp of spatial understanding, having mastered geometry, trigonometry, and calculus, which all contributed towards aspects of his artworks. As an avid reader and fan of old movies, he was especially fond of science fiction
