Dennis F. Blackman, 76, of Evansville, passed away, December 27, 2022 at the Linda E. White Hospice House with his wife and son by his side.

Dennis was born November 4, 1946 in Evansville to the late Frederick and Jewel Faye (Adams) Blackman. He was a tool and die maker by trade and was employed as a sales engineer for Evansville Sheet Metal. Prior to Evansville Sheet Metal he worked for Classic Industries, Evansville Tool and Die, Apex Tool and MFG and served his apprenticeship at Murphy's Engineering. Dennis loved to stay busy; he enjoyed his job as well as all of his fellow employees and customers which he called on. In his spare time, he enjoyed spending time remodeling the house, working in the garage on various projects from vehicle maintenance and working on motorcycles. You could often find Dennis on the weekends walking the dog Coco, keeping the yard looking nice and tinkering with something to do with a BSA motorcycle. Dennis was an active member of St. Boniface Catholic Church in earlier years, having devoted his time as a volunteer at the summer social as well as in the Fall Festival booth annually.

Surviving Dennis are his wife of 52 years, Dixie (Gish) Blackman; a son, Dr. Darrin Blackman, and a sister and brother-in-law, Judith and Curt Seib.

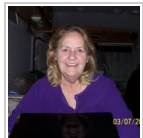
