Her divinity was always wonderful. She asked me how long I beat my egg whites to which I replied that the recipe I copied from Mom didn't say to beat them so I hadn't. Needless to say I to this day cannot make divinity. She also made a delicious German potato salad that I never could talk her into giving me the recipe - she knew I wasn't the cook in the family.
