Edwin G. Schenk, 80, of Evansville, passed away Monday, April 27, 2008 as the result of injuries sustained in an automobile accident.

Mr. Schenk had worked as a farmer, before working at Peerless Pottery for 25 years and later at International Steel, George Koch and Sons and Koch Originals before retiring in 1993. He was a member of St. Philip Catholic Church, St. Philip Conservation Club and the Sheet Metal Workers Local #20 Retirees Club.
