Floyd H. "Dutch" Titzer, 90, of Evansville, passed away Saturday, April 22, 2017 at Deaconess Hospital Main Campus of heart failure.

Dutch loved hunting, fishing and playing baseball. He played baseball for over 30 years and played semi-pro for Purple Hearts, I.K. League and the Double I League. Dutch also coached for many years at the St. Wendel Little League, Pony League and Double I League. He was a veteran of the United States Navy having served on the USS Remy from 1944-1946 and was a member of VFW Post #6576 in Wadesville.
