



## Fred McGrew

October 15, 1938 - November 3, 2010

Fred A. McGrew, age 72, of Evansville, passed away Wednesday, November 3, 2010 at his home.

Mr. McGrew had worked as a shop foreman for 19 years at Ohio Valley Pipeline before his retirement in 2003. He was a member of St. Peter's United Methodist Church. Fred loved his two sons and grandsons and enjoyed riding his four wheeler, fishing and watching the new homes being built in his community. He coached North Posey Little League baseball for 21 years.
