George Patton "Pat" Duncan, 74, of Evanville, passed away Friday, February 5, 2021 at Linda White Hospice House.

Pat was born on April 16, 1946 in Evansville to the late Clarence and Kathryn (Kasbohm) Duncan. He was a private investigator and worked in the collection business. He was a lifelong member of Central United Methodist Church and a member of the West Side Nut Club, West Side Optimist Club and a life member of VFW Post # 1114. Pat served in the United States Navy during the Vietnam War.
