James Timothy “Tim” Riordan, 76, of Evansville, passed away Wednesday, September 1, 2021 at Deaconess Hospital Midtown Campus surrounded by his loving family.

Tim was born December 1, 1944 in Evansville to the late James F. and Estelle (Barthel) Riordan. He worked as a railroad engineer for CSX Railroad before retiring after 42 years of service. Tim was actively involved in Boy Scout Troop/Crew 399 at Sacred Heart Church, where he served as a Scout Master from 1990 to 1994 and was a 399 Honorary Eagle. He was also actively involved in the Cursillo Movement with the Diocese of Evansville and with the St. Vincent de Paul Society.

Surviving Tim are his wife of 57 years, Susie (Flick) Riordan; two daughters, Lorri (Ed) Lappe and Karen (Greg) Weinzapfel and two sons, Jim (Kim) Riordan and Matthew (Kate) Riordan, all of Evansville. Also surviving Tim are fourteen grandchildren, Dave (Kristen) Lappe, Derek (Jenna) Lappe, Drew (Audrey) Lappe, Evan, Logan and Blake Weinzapfel, Grant, Marissa, Hallie and Ella Riordan, Steeve (Rachel) Jean, James, Simon and Anne Riordan and five great grandchildren, Cameron, Alison, Grayson, Anderson and Zoey Lappe.

In addition to his parents, Tim was preceded in death by two sisters, Mary Ann

Hironimus and Linda L. Goebel.
