John W. Dycus, II, 73 of Evansville, passed away Sunday, October 18, 2020 at Deaconess Hospital Midtown Campus.

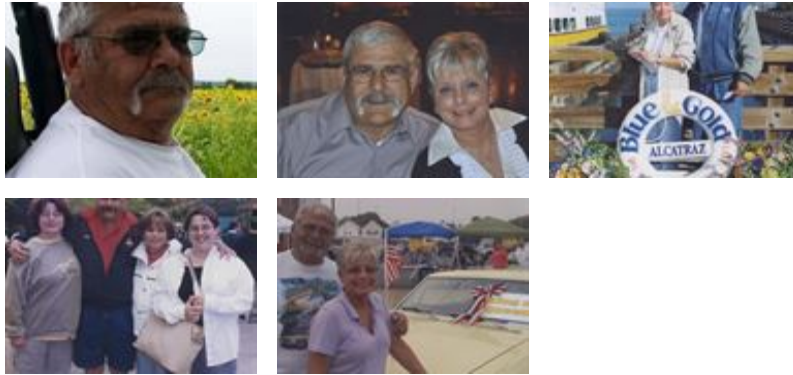
