Joseph M. Goodrid, 77, of Evansville, passed away Friday, February 19, 2021 at his home.

Joe was born May 2, 1943 in Washington, IN to the late Joseph and Mary Goodrid. He worked as a private investigator for over 30 years and for the last 13 years as a greeter at Wal Mart. Joe was a 1961 graduate of FJ Reitz High School, where he played on the football team and was named Midwest All American. Joe was very instrumental in starting the Evansville Junior Football League on Evansville's west side. He was also active in politics in the Republican Party; was a member of the Masonic Lodge, Scottish Rite and Hadi Shrine. He was definitely a people person.

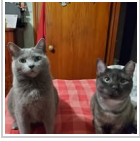

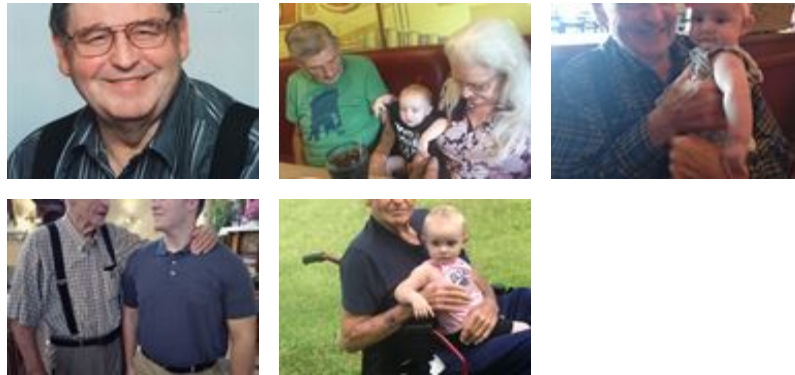
