



Kevin Winternheimer

January 14, 1955 - August 7, 2007

Kevin Winternheimer, 52, of Evansville, passed away Tuesday, August 7, 2007 at Deaconess Hospital due to complications of pancreatic cancer.

Kevin graduated from Mt. Vernon High School in 1973, received his Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Evansville in 1977 and his law degree from Indiana University School of Law at Indianapolis in 1980.

He spent his entire career as a public servant. He became assistant City Attorney in 1980. He served four Evansville mayors as City Attorney and assistant City Attorney. He had also served two years as Attorney for Vanderburgh County and maintained a small private practice. Kevin was a Board member and past president of the Indiana Municipal Lawyers Association and was a presenter on various Municipal Law issues at seminars of the Municipal Lawyers Association and the Indiana Association of Cities and Towns.

Kevin is survived by his wife of 28 years, Kimberly (Griswold) Winternheimer, his son, Matthew and his mother, Agnes Winternheimer. A sister and brother-in-law, Diane and Bob Koch and a brother and sister-in-law, Dr. Keith and Peg Winternheimer, aunt and uncle, Syl and Wilma Winternheimer, an aunt, Julie Burns, Kim's family and nieces also survive him.

He was preceded in death by his father, Clarence Winternheimer.

A memorial service honoring Kevin's memory will be held at Immanuel United Church of Christ, 5812 N. Ford Road, Mt. Vernon, Indiana, Saturday, August 11, 2007 at 1:00 P.M., Rev. Paul Seburg officiating.
