“ *Donny, Mike Caraker here. I don't know if you remember me, I met Larry in Ms. Beesaw's third grade class at Centennial, where his first comment to me concerned my bushy hair. I really appreciated having a fast friend in a new town and a new school. We moved out of the district a few years later, and our paths crossed again at Reitz High School, where we became members of a small, tight knit group. I remember spending time at your house on Pennsylvania, talking with your Mom and Dad, discussions of the Brush family's travails. ...and driving around in your Dad's Oldsmobile. After graduation, we discovered a shared a love of British sports cars, and we used to terrorize the rural residents of the county on a regular basis, he in his Triumph TR3, and I in my MG midget. My wife Francie (class of '68) and I double dated with Larry and his first wife and babysat Marcy on more than one occasion. I remember boating on the Ohio in Larry's new, used boat, and spending evenings in their house on Barker, or our mobile home in Cynthiana. We remained close friends until I joined the Air Force in 1974, when Francie and I left Evansville to see the world. Sporadic contact followed for the next two decades plus. I last saw Larry at my mother's funeral, in 2000. We hugged, and caught up with each other over the next few weeks, then and during several long phone calls between California and Indiana.
