Lauren Hahn, 37, of Lincoln City, OR died unexpectedly in January of natural causes. Born in Evansville, IN on July 31st, 1982, Lauren is survived by her parents, Michael "Curt" Hahn of Evansville, Barbara Hahn of Lincoln City, siblings Sarah, Eric, Molly and Shannon, nephew Mason and niece Sofie. Lauren was preceded in death by her brother Kevin.
