Leo G. Muensterman, 92, of Evansville, passed away Sunday, March 9, 2014 at University Nursing & Rehab, formerly known as the Little Sisters of the Poor.

Leo was a life member of Sacred Heart Catholic Church and was a long time Whirlpool employee. He started at Whirlpool June 28, 1946 and retired September 1, 1983 as a Press Shop Set Up Man. Leo was a veteran of the US Army, serving overseas during WW II.

Surviving Leo are his wife of 63 years, Frances (Hurst) Muensterman along with four sons, Joseph (Pam), Henry, Thomas and Paul Muensterman. Also surviving him are his twin sister Leona Strange, six grandchildren, ten great grandchildren, nieces and nephews.
