Leonard F. Voegel, I, age 88, of Evansville, passed away Sunday, April 06, 2014 at Deaconess Hospital Main Campus.

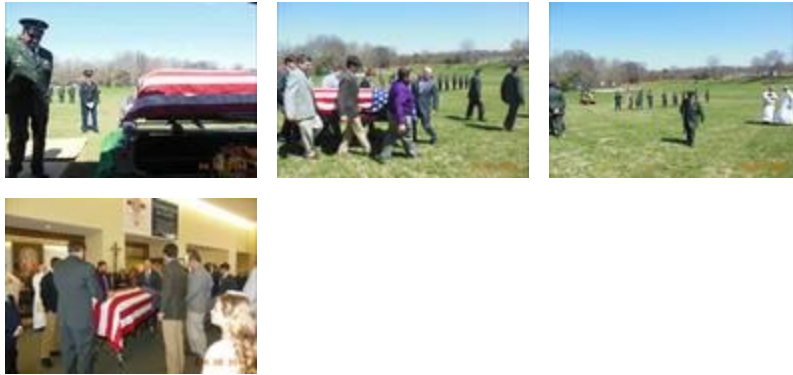
