Louis John Neisen, age 91, of Evansville, passed away Saturday, August 15, 2015 at the Park Terrace Village.

Louis was born March 7, 1924 in Evansville to the late Francis and Mary (Rexing) Neisen. He was a 1942 graduate of FJ Reitz High School. Louis was a former president of the Amalgamated Transit Union Local 878, worked as a bus driver, including driving for the Memorial High School Athletic Department.
