Lucille E. (Schutte) Altstadt, 89, of Evansville, passed away Wednesday, January 20, 2010 at Pine Haven Health & Rehabilitation Center.

Lucille was born July 14, 1920 in Mt. Vernon, IN. She graduated from Reitz Memorial High School in 1939. In 1955, she graduated from DeVry's School of Beauty Culture and for the next 27 years owned and operated Lou's Beauty Shop while working evenings at Willow Bowling Center.

Lou was one of the original organizers of Sacred Heart Boy Scout Troop # 99, presently Troop # 399. She herself was an active girl scout at Sacred Heart Church where she attended grade school.

Lucille was an avid bowler. She enjoyed playing the organ, cooking, sewing, crafts, candy making, cake decorating, working puzzles and gardening. She loved animals. She loved taking care of her grandchildren when they were younger and feeding them as they got older.

Lucille was preceded in death by her parents, Frank G. and Estelle (Deutsch) Schutte and her brother, William Schutte.

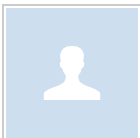
