Margaret D. Barron, 84, of Evansville, passed away Wednesday, April 28, 2021 at the Golden Living Center Woodlands in Newburgh.

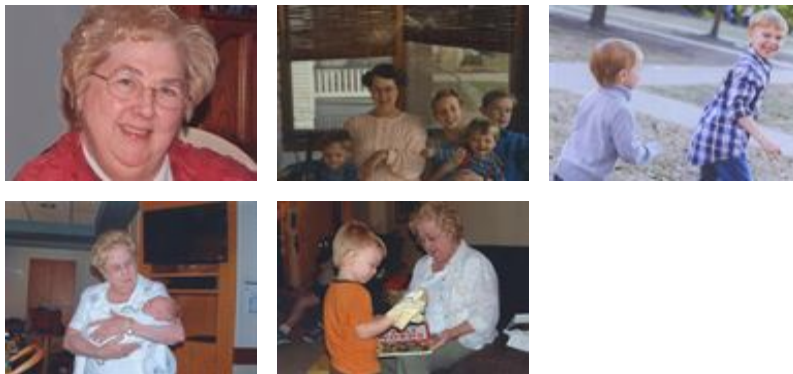
