



## Marlin F Krieg

January 22, 1934 - December 27, 2019

Marlin F. Krieg, 85, of Evansville, passed away Friday, December 27, 2019 at his home.

Marlin was born January 22, 1934 in St. Charles, MO to the late George and Sylvia (Smith) Krieg. He was a 1955 graduate of the Missouri School of Mines with a degree in petroleum engineering. He served in the United States Army in 1957 and completed his military service in the US Army Reserves. Marlin worked for more than 50 years as a consulting petroleum engineer and operated an independent engineering firm, Oilfield Research, Inc. He was inducted into the Indiana Oil and Gas Association Hall of Fame for his dedicated service to the industry. Marlin also served as president of the Tupman Cemetery Board of Directors. Marlin enjoyed baseball, softball, bowling, horse racing and working. He loved his dog Lady, who was his constant companion and routinely went to work with him.

Surviving Marlin are his loving wife, Charlene Krieg; sons, Jeffrey (Sue) Krieg, Steven (Cheryl) Krieg and David (Susan) Krieg; stepdaughters, Cindy Ratliff and Ginger (Jimmie) Dame; stepsons, Gary (Marilyn) Blahovic, Donald Kibby and Shawn (Marylou) Stanley; as well as many loving grandchildren and great grandchildren.
