November 5, 1930 - January 1, 2020

Marylou (Russler) Ulrich, 89, of Evansville, passed away Wednesday, January 1, 2020 at the Heritage Center.

Marylou was born November 5, 1930 in Evansville to the late Roman and Marie (Hansert) Russler.
