



## Mary L. "Tootie" Guinn

Mary L. Guinn, 77, of Evansville, passed away Saturday, February 28, 2009 at Deaconess Hospital.

Mary, the former "Tootie" Miller of Parker Settlement, retired after 40 years with the Indiana Employment Security Division. She began there as a switchboard operator before working in the Placement Division and finally in the Unemployment Claims Division, from which she retired as Department Manager in 1993. She was very active in the Riverbend Association and the Germania Maennerchor Women's Group. She was a member of the AARP Westside Chapter and the Indiana Employment Security Division Retirees Group. Mary was a 1949 graduate of Wadesville High School and thoroughly enjoyed bowling, traveling, and playing bingo and video poker.
