Nicholas Coy Adams died peacefully at his home on September 22, 2024.

Nick was born on September 7, 1946, to Albert “Bud” Adams and Margaret (Faust) Adams in Evansville, Indiana. He graduated from Rex Mundi High School in 1964 and was a member of the school’s 1963-1964 basketball team that played in the state championship game.

Following graduation, Nick played basketball at Butler University for one year before joining the Navy and serving during the Vietnam War. After his naval service, he returned to Evansville and utilized the G.I. Bill to attend classes at the University of Evansville and the University of Southern Indiana, where he discovered a love of history. He enjoyed historical documentaries and discussing history, politics, and music throughout his life.

Nick worked for the Whirlpool Corporation for over 30 years, where he was a proud member of the International Union of Electrical Workers Local 808 IUE-CWA. Following his retirement, Nick continued to play basketball regularly and loved sharing his passion for the game with everyone he knew.

He is preceded in death by his parents, daughter Molly Adams, and wife, Carol (Morris) Adams. He is survived by his children Jill Benvenuti, Steven Adams, Katherine Mabbitt (Clay), and Elizabeth Trotzke (Mike), five
