December 4, 1917 - April 12, 2007

Oscar A. Bippus, 89, died Thursday April 12, 2007, at Deaconess Hospital. He was a sheet metal worker for over 60 years and retired from Evansville Sheet Metal in 1983 after 37 years. He was the founder of the Sheet Metal Workers Local #20 apprenticeship school. He was a WW II veteran and served in the U. S. Army Air Corp. He was a lifetime member of VFW Post 1114. He was a founding member of Resurrection Catholic Church.

He is survived by his wife of 66 years, Ruth; daughter, Patricia Allen; sons, Michael and David who live in Evansville, Richard who lives in Baltimore, MD, and William who lives in Houston, TX; 11 grandchildren, and 8 great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will begin at 11:00 A.M. Monday, April 16, 2007 at Resurrection Catholic Church, Rev. Philip Kreilein officiating. Entombment will follow in St. Joseph Catholic Cemetery.
