Paul C. Beasley, 90, of Henderson, KY passed away at Woodlands Nursing Home in Newburgh, IN on Sunday, June 19, 2016. He was born on October 14th, 1925 in Nashville, TN. He was predeceased by his wife of 34 years, Gerri G. Beasley.

He is survived by his twin sons, Kirk T. Beasley and wife Donna, and Matthew S. Beasley and wife Leslie.

Paul was a Marine Aviation Mechanic in World War II, and, upon his return from service, attended Middle Tennessee State University and Florida State University where he earned Bachelors and Master's Degrees in Social Work. Throughout his career as a social worker, he was dedicated to helping others. During the early part of his career, he worked in Alabama and Florida focused on helping individuals overcome alcoholism. Later, he moved to Kentucky and set up a private practice with offices in both Owensboro and Henderson where he expanded his services to include marriage and family counseling.

Paul had many interests including hunting, fishing, gardening, and music. He played guitar, harmonica, and piano. He was also a skilled artist and was especially good at painting landscapes in oil. Examples of his work could be seen in every room of his house and he proudly displayed some of his best works in his room at Woodlands.

Paul also loved animals. He raised chickens, rabbits, and pigeons and always had dogs as companions. His favorite dog breed was the Border Collie.

Throughout the last 20 years of his life he always had a Border Collie at his

side – first there was Tiger, then his beloved Storm who was with him until just three years ago.
