



## Ravah Lee Wicks

March 11, 1944 - March 30, 2026

Ravah Lee (Will) Wicks, 82, of Evansville, passed away peacefully on Monday, March 30, 2026.

Ravah was born on March 11, 1944, in Evansville to the late Raymond L. and Esther (Brune) Will. She was a 1962 graduate of Mater Dei High School and a member of St. Agnes and St. Boniface Catholic Churches. Ravah was devoted to the Blessed Mother and praying the rosary. She worked as a beautician for many years before retiring at the age of 72. Ravah started her career at Lou's Beauty Shop before opening Ravah's Beauty Shop. She also worked as a beautician at the Little Sister's of the Poor and the Parkview Care Center.
