March 11, 1934 - May 30, 2007

Ray Andrews, 73, of Princeton, passed away Wednesday, May 30, 2007 at Deaconess Hospital.

Ray was a member of St. Wendel Catholic Church for over 30 years. During this time he was a Uniform Member of the Knights of St. John, president of St. Wendel Parish Council several times in the mid 1980's and president of Knights of St. John 282 from 1984-1986. Ray was also a Eucharistic Minister and was usually seen as a reader many Sundays and religious holidays. The past few years after moving to Princeton he became a member of St. Joseph Catholic Church in Princeton.

Ray had a full and colorful career. He was a Constable in Canada, Field Manager for Family Life Insurance in Canada, DJ at WJPS in Zephyrhills, Florida, Vice President of Chayes Virginia in Evansville, owned and operated Executive Sales in Cynthiana, owned and operated Life Like Denture Center in Evansville, ending his career as manager of LUV Homes in Evansville. Ray was retired.

Ray's claim to fame is having wrestled a brown bear. Ray loved playing the guitar, organ and singing at family gatherings. Ray also sang at the Knights of St. John home in St. Wendel and the TLC Restaurant in Evansville for the sheer joy of entertaining. He was born in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan Canada.

He became a Naturalized American citizen.

Ray is survived by his wife of 55 years, Dorothy, son Ray and his wife, Paula, of Sugar Grove, IL, daughter Laura-Lee Dunn and her husband, David, of Princeton, daughter, Cheryl Burand and her husband, David, of Fishers, IN, brothers, Gary and his wife, Corie, of Saskatoon, Saskatchewan Canada and Bill and his wife, Marge, of Moose-Jaw, Saskatchewan Canada and grandchildren, Max and Cooper Andrews, Kristin Burand and David and Austin Dunn.

Ray was preceded in death by a daughter, Linda Andrews in 2004.

Funeral services will be held at 10:00 A.M. Monday, June 4, 2007 at St. Wendel Catholic Church, Rev. Edward Schnur officiating. Burial will follow in the church cemetery.
