Reba Mae Inboden, 63, of Evansville, passed away Wednesday, July 27, 2016 at Deaconess Hospital Main Campus.

Reba was born June, 28, 1953 in Palestine, IL. She was a graduate of Palestine High School and went to Beauty College in Olney, IL. She worked as a beautician for several years but had to give up hair dressing for health reasons. She later worked for several different places, the newspaper office, Carter Lumber in Pittsboro, IN and in the office of Sennit in Indianapolis. Because of her declining health, Reba chose to move to Evansville to be near her mother and stepfather, Bernice and Harold Seaney.

As long as her health permitted, Reba lived life to the fullest. She was an avid fan of NASCAR, the St. Louis Cardinals and good old country music. Her dream was to attend a NASCAR race or Cardinals game, but she never could because of her health. She did get to attend many concerts though and planned to go see Alabama with her mother in October when they are in Evansville.

Surviving Reba are her mother, Bernice "Bernie" Seaney; her father, Kenneth Inboden; brother, David Inboden and a niece, Billie Jean Trevett, who Reba always thought of as her own daughter. She is also survived by Billie Jean's husband, Matt; their children, Macey, Chase, McKenna and Willow of

Whitesboro, TX; a nephew, Lucas Inboden in the US Air Force and his family, Missy and Layla, of Las Vegas, NV and Amaya who is in Germany.

Reba was preceded in death by her stepfather, Harold Seaney; by both sets of her grandparents and by many cousins and friends.
