Richard J. Gannon, 84, of Haubstadt, IN, passed away Wednesday, August 9, 2006 at VNA Charlier Hospice Center.

Mr. Gannon was a member of St. James Catholic Church in Haubstadt. He had served in the U. S. Army during W. W. II. where he was awarded the Purple Heart. Richard was a graduate of New York State College of Forestry at Syracuse University. Mr. Gannon had worked for the Social Security Administration for 22 years before retiring in 1982. He served as a volunteer at the Christian Life Center, St. Vincent de Paul Society, Meals on Wheels and assisted adults in a reading program. He served on the Board of Directors of Visiting Nurse Association and in 1964; he served as president of the Carrolton Club of Whittier, CA.

He and his wife organized the Muffins for Memorial Day Service at Powell Cemetery in rural Haubstadt, which has been well attended for 15 years.
