



## Robert "Bob" Ray

Robert J. Ray, age 65, of Evansville, passed away on Monday, September 21, 2009 at the Deaconess Hospice Care Center.

Bob worked for the United States Postal Service for 31 years before retiring in 2000 and later worked for Schnuck's and Wal-Mart for the past six years. He loved the Civic Theatre and Newburgh Theatre and had acted in many plays. He loved comedy and games shows and had appeared on the game show "Say When" many years ago. Bob was a friend of Bill W. and had served his country in the United States Navy and was Sergeant of Arms at the Disable American Veterans.
