Timothy D. Kaiser, 45, of Evansville, passed away Sunday, September 3, 2006 at Deaconess Hospital.

Tim worked for the Evansville Courier for 25 years in a job he truly loved as the Assistant Sports Editor. He loved baseball, baseball card collections, and was a frustrated Reds fan. Tim was a member of Sacred Heart Catholic Church and had been an Eagle Scout with Troop #99 the church.
